Named Colorado Hereford Association Breeders of the Year*



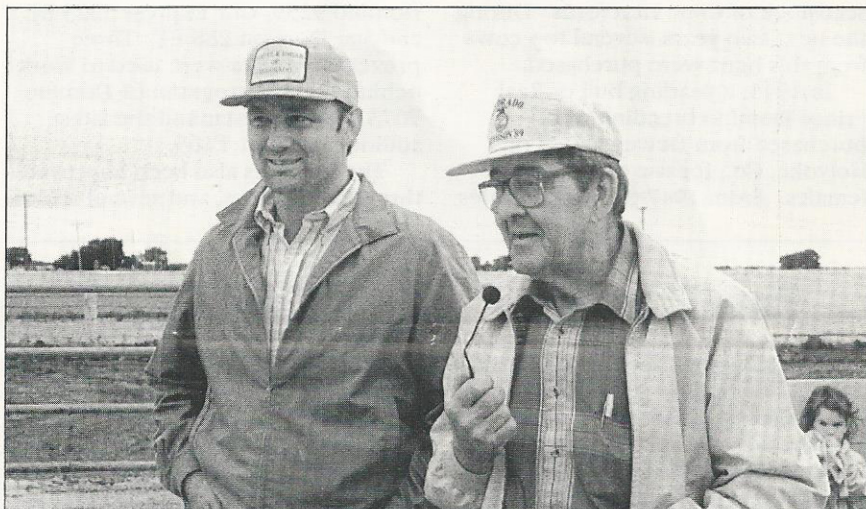

This year's recipients of the "Breeder of the Year" award are registered breeder Cline Herefords of Wiley, and commercial breeders Jim Taussig of Kremmling and Jim McMillin of Lamar. ## Cline Herefords

Cline Herefords is located in southeastern Colorado in the Arkansas Valley town of Wiley. It is operated as a partnership between Joe Cline and his son, Stanley.

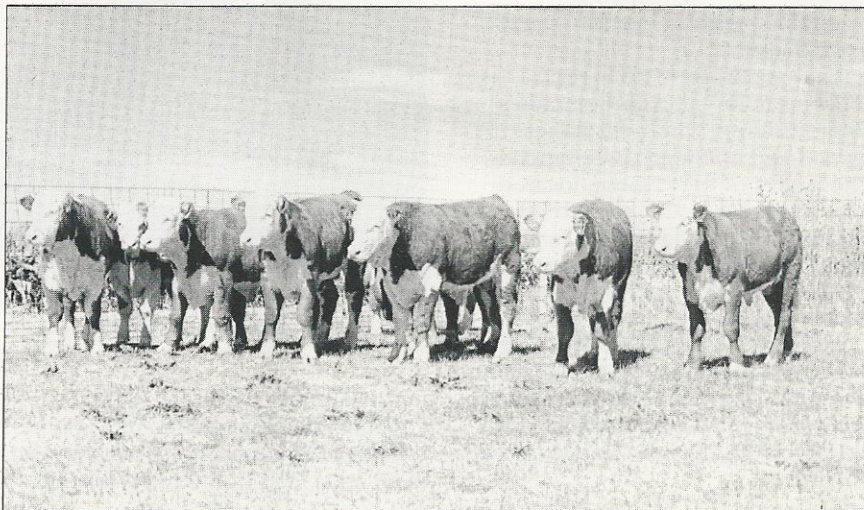
Together, they have perpetuated the standard of excellence for purebred Hereford cattle established by Cline Herefords almost 50 years ago. Joe and his wife Bonnie live on the ranch and farm that were established in 1902 by Joe's grandfather, Harry Cline. In addition, Joe runs an irrigated farming operation. Stanley operates Bonnie's parent's irrigated farms just a short distance away from the home place.

Cline Herefords has always been a family operation. Joe and Bonnie have three children, Stanley, Tami and Stephen. Stanley, 35, and his wife Lora have two daughters,

# Cline Herefords Sending 2 Bulls to CHA Sale

Combining irrigated farmland, grassland and irrigated pasture, Joe Cline has been breeding registered Herefords since 1944 on his ranch west of Wiley.

The Cline Hereford Ranch was established in 1902 when Harry Cline, Joe's grandfather, first settled the original quarter section that now is a part of the 1,700 acres that Joe and his family farm and ranch.

The Cline operation is comprised of 700 irrigated acres on which Joe raises; milo, alfalfa, wheat and oats, and 1,000 acres of grasslands.

Cline now has 65 acres of irrigated pasture land with

plans to add 35 more acres by 1973. The irrigated pasture is planted in intermediate wheat, orchard and broome grass with nomad alfalfa. This land is used to pasture cattle at the rate of one cow per

acres. Cline says that this might be improved and with proper management he hopes to pasture one and a half cows to the acres in the future.

The Cline Hereford ranch herd presently numbers 20 head of heifers, 60 registered cows and 25 commercial cows. Since starting his registered Herefords in 1944 Cline has been phasing out his commercial business and building to a fully registered herd.

Cline uses three herd bulls in his business. His main herd sire is W Super H 92 and is owned by Cline and Albert Bahler and Sons of Holyoke, Colorado. His other two bulls are W Real T207 and CH Real Advance 0158.

Cline purchased W Real T207 two years ago at the National Western Stock show and he raised CH Real Advance 0158. He says, he is very pleased with the performance of these bulls and that they have produced some very fine cattle for him from his Baldwin and Tex Real Onward dams.

The quality of Cline Herefords has been shown at the Colorado Hereford Sale in Pueblo during the 1969 and '71 sales. Joe has again consigned to the sale with two fine bulls; CH Shadow 1192 the Lot 13 bulls and CH Super Baron 1181 the Lot 14 bull, at this years 22nd Annual Colorado Hereford Association Sale in Pueblo on Wednesday, December 6.

The Cline Hereford Ranch is a family operation with everybody doing their part in raising fine registered Herefords.

Joe and his wife Bonnie have three children: Stanley, 16 a junior at McClave High; Tami, 13, an eighth grade student at McClave and Steve,

champion breeding stock at both fairs in 1971 and taking champion breeding honors in 1972 at the Bent County Fair.

Tami has been active in 4-H for the past four years during this time she has shown

Hereford steers and breeding stock. The Reserve Champion Award for Steers at the Bent County Fair in 1969 was won by Tami.

The operation at Cline Herefords has been steadily

increasing due to the efforts of Joe and his family and their work will add to the quality of the Hereford bulls on sale at the Colorado Hereford Association Sale in Pueblo this year.
